

For the Financial Years 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15, the total difference between Income & Expenditure was Rs. 55.55 Lacs and the depreciation was Rs. 138.99 Lakh. Thus the cash in hand available with the University is Rs. 83.44 lacs. Moreover, the collection of fees has increased by 21% in one year. The Society is



also giving capital grants to the University for
infrastructure development. Thus the University
has sufficient funds.

The committee has interacted with all stake holders makes the following observations:-

- In general the university authorities seem to be Enthusiastic, Motivated and Resourceful.
- The University needs proper academic guidance for further develop it in a befitting manner.
- Due attention be paid to soft skill development of students since good number of them come from rural areas.
- Good number of experienced and research oriented faculty members may be recruited.
- Sophisticated equipments be acquired in a progressive manner ----- for teaching and research.
- Mandates of the statutory bodies be adhered to.
- Experts from specific fields should be invited to enrich and update the knowledge of the teachers.

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- Non Doctorate faculty members be insisted upon completion of their Ph.D as early as possible. University is advised to facilitate the process.
- The University must codify all the courses of studies in hierarchical manner e.g. school of studies consisting of concerned department. For instance, School of Engineering shall comprise of Department of Chemical Engineering, Department of Mechanical Engineering etc.
- B. Operations recommendations which require satisfactory compliance by the University before issue of approval letter
  - Codification of academic programs as explained above.
  - Some essential improvements in the labs in terms of optimum numbers of instruments, equipments, chemicals and glass wares, exhaust fans and installation of industrial type fire extinguishers.
  - Operationalization of the kitchens and dining halls of the boy's hostels.
  - Reallocation of the designated girl's hostel.
- C. Final Recommendations

The committee unanimously recommends the grant of letter of approval to the University. However the University is advised to take remedial steps to rectify the deficiencies as highlighted above.
